Good news! The Household Support Fund has reopened and you can now put through applications again.

Professionals can make a referral to the HSF with anyone who they work with who they feel would benefit from this support.

Residents are entitled to HSF if they are in receipt of Pension Credit or have a child in receipt of free school meals living with them on your property, they should receive a letter from Nottinghamshire County Council inviting them to reply.

St Johns Cafe Opening

On Saturday 27th September I went to the first official event put on by St Johns Cafe! Upon arrival I found that the cafe was filled with happy customers all chatting away and enjoying an afternoon tea. It was really wonderful to see so many people in this space and as I kept saying to Judith "it looks like a real cafe!"

They have lots of plans for the future starting with a Saturday morning cafe, Family Barn Dance, Cafe and Christmas Fair and a Festive Afternoon Tea. Prices and times are on the picture below. The aim of the cafe is to provide a space for the community to come together, socialise, hold special events such as birthdays, baby showers, christenings and so on, one of the main aims is that it is accessible and affordable.

The cafe has been 3 years in that making the first conversation which envisioned what could be possible was had in September 2022 when myself and Judith met and discussed the ways in which they could get involved in the food provisions within Mansfield. The initial thought was to open a food provision and then look to open a cafe after this. The food club was up and running in December 2022 and is still running, now almost exactly 3 years to the day the cafe is open!!

This has been made possible due to UKSPF funding and all the hard work of the staff and volunteers at St Johns Centre.

We are planning to hold a Feeding Mansfield Meeting here in the near future so you can see it all for yourselves!
