Make sure it makes sense!</p>	<p>Offline Activity 2</p> <p>Look at the sheet provided about nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs and prepositions. Then answer the questions.</p> <p>Common noun = things, names, places and people.</p> <p>Proper noun = like a common noun but words that need capitals.</p> <p>Adjective = describing word.</p> <p>Verb = doing word (often ends in 'ing').</p> <p>Adverb = Describes the verb (doing word) e.g. Swam <u>quickly</u>, <u>hopped slowly</u>.</p> <p>Preposition = Tells us where something is e.g. on, under, over, next to, , above, inside.</p>

In the second week, each of these 2 branches split into another 2 branches - making 4 branches altogether. This keeps happening every week, until at the end of the sixth week each branch grows a flower. If you add a multiple of 10 to a multiple of 5 the answer is a multiple of 5	


