PE Kit

As you know PE is a very important part of your child's education and we have developed a timetable to ensure all children have clear regular PE Sessions indoors and outdoors (weather permitting). In addition to this, we will continue the Daily Mile. As a result, your child will need to have their PE kits in school every day and it does not need to be taken home after every lesson as it can get forgotten for the next lesson.

Due to health and safety reasons wearing the appropriate clothing in school is VERY important. Please can you ensure that your child is provided with a white t-shirt and black shorts for indoor PE and a white t-shirt and black or dark jumper and jogging bottoms / track suit for outdoor PE. These can be purchased very cheaply from places like Sports Direct, Tesco, Asda or Matalan. Trainers or plimsolls are required.

We also have a no jewelry policy for health and safety reasons and children will be required to remove their own ear rings. All our local secondary schools have strict guidelines on uniform and PE kit and if the boundaries are set in Primary School then the children will see a consistent approach throughout their education.
