EYFS

The EYFS team have been busy developing the F2 outdoor area. Thank you to everyone that has donated items to us – the children have absolutely loved it! KS1 (Years 1 and 2)

As part of our vehicle on 'London's Burning', we learnt all about 'The Great Fire of London'. We found out about the reasons why the fire spread so quickly and lasted for so long. In order for us to test out these reasons, we undertook a design technology project to find out about how Tudor houses were made and what was used to make them. We then designed our own Tudor houses, thinking about how we could replicate different parts of the fire. Our houses had jetties, straw for thatched roofs and were made of cardboard to replicate the Tudor houses being very flammable. We then laid out our houses close together to see if once one of the houses was set on fire, whether the fire would spread quickly. Despite the heavy rain, the fire spread rapidly and before we knew it, the houses had all been reduced to ashes!
