Here at Sutton Road Primary School, we will always hold the health, wellbeing and personal development of the children in our care as one of our highest priorities. Relationships, sex and health education is extremely important for our young people. It aims to help them to understand their bodies & their emotions and it can prepare them for the next important stage in their lives.

We at Sutton Road Primary School, want our children to learn about this subject in a **responsible, thoughtful and caring way**. Our health, sex and relationships education program is embedded in our PSHE planning (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) and is taught as a series of lessons for your child. Research shows that children who have good relationships and sex education are better prepared to cope with the pressures they will face in the outside world.

The Year 6 pupils will take part in a series of lessons after half term and will commence from Monday 12th June.
