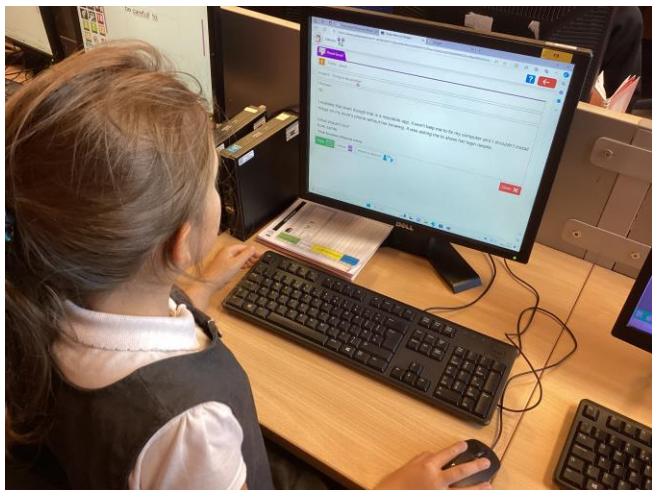

is also offered to students in  
Year 9.
