

# A word from Emma Severn, Head of School



I am pleased to welcome you and your family to Sutton Road Primary School.

#### **Entering School**

Children and families should enter the school playground before the start of the school day, most children play on the playground near their classroom at this time. The classroom doors open at 8.30am and children can begin to make their way into class, then learning begins at 8.40am.

During the school day the school gates are locked to ensure all our children are safe throughout the day, all gates to the site are locked from 8.50am – 3.00pm. Our school office is open for your enquiries from 8.30am until 9.30am in the morning and between 2.30pm and 3.30pm in the afternoon.

Entry to the school site is via the main school gate opposite the shop. Please press the buzzer for the Office Staff to release the gate.

Please note dogs are not allowed on the school playground.

Smoking or vaping is not allowed on the school site.

#### **Attendance and Lateness**

It is very important that your child attends school everyday and we encourage attendance through a range of school rewards.

It is also important that your child arrives on time to start their learning at 8.50am. If for any reason you arrive late, please enter school by the main school gate and inform the School Office staff of your child's arrival and they will mark them late in the register and also ask if a school meal is to be ordered.

# **Holidays During Term Time**

If you decide that you need to take your child out of school during term time due to extenuating circumstances, holiday forms are available on our website.

# **Playtime Snacks**

We only allow fruit or a **healthy snack** at playtime. Fruit is provided free to all F2 and KS1 pupils.



We run a Tuesday Tuckshop each week, parents can order an item of food for their child and pay via Parentmail

#### **Cool Milk**



Throughout your child's time in Sutton Road Primary School milk is provided. Until the age of 5 years milk is free. Unless your child is in receipt of free school meals, after your child's 5<sup>th</sup> birthday milk has to be paid for.

Parents who wish their child to have school milk will need to register with Coolmilk — **www.coolmilk.com** the company who operates the School Milk Scheme on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council.

Parents of children under 5 years will also need to register their child in order for them to have milk.

#### **Lunch Times**

Parents and children have the choice for the child to have either school lunches or bring in sandwiches from home.

When the children arrive in school in the morning when the Attendance register is taken children will be asked if they are having a school meal or if they have bought sandwiches from home.

All meals are to be purchased via our electronic cashless payment system- Parentmail.

Water is always available at dinner time or children may bring their own juice for lunchtimes only.

No fizzy drinks or sweets are allowed, and only chocolate covered biscuits, not chocolate bars in their lunch boxes.





Children may qualify for free school meals if they attend a Nottinghamshire County Council School and the parent/carer receives one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after the person stops qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

#### **Registering for Free School Meals**

You can register for free school meals online, there is a link on our school website or by telephoning: **0300 500 80 80**. The information needed to register includes:

- Personal details (including national insurance number and date of birth) for the parent/carer
- Child's details in full including their date of birth and the school they attend.

If eligible for free school meals, the start date will normally be within two working days of parents contacting Nottinghamshire Council and entitlement being verified. We will also write to confirm the date the child's free school meals and milk will start.

You may not want your child to have the free school meals but if you are entitled to them please claim. All children that are Year 3 and above will need to pay for their school meals. Please contact the school office if you require any help completing the relevant forms

Also, in addition to this, and to encourage and improve good attendance, if your child is Pupil Premium and has attendance above 95% for the academic year you will receive an additional £20 uniform discount at the end of the year in July. If a year 6 Pupil Premium child is eligible for this then they will be given a gift of stationery supplies to support with moving on to their next school.

All children in Foundation Stage 2 and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a Universal Infant Free School meal **BUT you still need to register and claim for free school meals in order to access the many additional financial benefits as stated above.** 

# **Breakfast and After School Club**

We have a Breakfast Club which runs before school starts and an After-school Club which takes place once school is finished.

Places **must** be booked in advance.

Children are taken to their classes at the end of the Breakfast Club and collected from their classes to be taken to the After School Club.

Opening times for Breakfast Club are: 7.45am to 8.40am. Opening times for After School Club are: 3.10pm to 5.45pm.

An information leaflet is available should you wish to use this facility, please pop into the school office.

# **Safeguarding**

There are a number of Designated People for Safeguarding in our school and a designated governor. If you have any concerns about the safety or care of a child please speak to a member of staff.

As a school we are vigilant in dealing with concerns that arise or that staff observe and take the relevant action in accordance with the Notts Safeguarding Children's Partnership.

# **Religious Education**

As in the Nottinghamshire Agreed Syllabus RE teaches us the significance and impact of religions as well as how different religious teachings influence an individual. RE teaches us how to be an individual and emphasizes the importance of being yourself, no matter what. We will also be looking at different world views on issues.

If you don't not wish your child to participate in religious worship or instruction, we are happy to make other arrangements, but ask that you meet with our RE lead to discuss this beforehand.



# **School Uniform**

We believe that a school uniform is important for the following reasons:

- It looks smart and gives a sense of belonging
- It eliminates social problems caused by latest fashion trends
- It contributes to a feeling of pride within our school.

We ask that all children wear the uniform and we encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

Long hair should be tied back with appropriate discrete school - coloured hair accessories.

Polo shirt:	black, red or white – with optional logo
Blouse/shirt:	(optional) white
Jumper (or sweatshirt/cardigan):	Red or black - with optional logo
Fleece jacket: (optional)	black zip-up with optional logo
Skirt / Pinafore / trousers:	black / grey
Shoes:	dark coloured, sensible leather-type sturdy shoes or boots with no more than 1 inch heels. Soft footwear is not safe or appropriate for school.

# **Physical Education (PE)**

Your child will be doing P.E. every week.

Our P.E. uniform is:



T-shirt:	preferably white
Shorts:	black
Plimsolls:	for indoors
Trainers:	for outside games
Tracksuit bottoms / leggings:	preferably dark colours
Tracksuit tops / sports tops:	preferably dark colours

Children are to bring their PE kit in a bag every week so that they can change into their PE kit in school.

# For insurance purposes we have a strict rule that NO Jewellery is to be worn for P.E. including earrings.

(We advise having ears pierced during the beginning of the summer holiday)

# **Swimming**

Pupils will also have the opportunity to go swimming during their time at Sutton Road Primary School.



For swimming a full swimming costume (not bikini) or swimming trunks should be worn – N.B. swimming shorts are not allowed at the swimming baths for health and safety reasons.

Swimming hats must be worn over long hair. A towel will be needed from home.

Long hair must be tied back in a ponytail and earrings must be taken out. The children will also need a towel from home.

#### Please be aware No Jewellery must be worn for swimming.

These are Nottinghamshire County Council policies.

#### Communication



All letters and information is sent to our parents via email through our Parentmail App.

To receive emails parents / carers need to ensure we have up to date details. Parents may also register their mobile number with school allow us to send text messages for example, to remind parents of events, payment dates etc as well as short notice school closures.

Please speak to the School Office for assistance.

Parents receive a weekly newsletter which includes a diary of events and information about what is happening in school. This is published on a Monday.

Please check your emails regularly to ensure that you keep up to date with what's happening in school.
