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Maths

Try to solve these problems.

Noah saw 12 legs walk past him when he was loading up the ark.

How many creatures could he have seen? How many different answers can you find? What creatures could there be? How many legs do they each have?

Eg; octopus, dog 8 + 4 = 12bird, cat, ladybird 2 + 4 + 6 = 12

You could draw the creatures in your book then write the addition calculations.

Challenge – What is the greatest number of creatures he could have seen? What is the smallest number of creatures he could have seen?

Writing

The writing challenges this week have been split into two sessions and is based upon BBC Bitesize's Daily Lessons for Year 2 (the days for each session are previous dates on BBC Bitesize). We have included a summary here of the learning that will take place and a link for each session on the Bitesize page. Each of the sessions are flexible and could be done at your child's own pace (e.g. over more than one day). It is also important to point out that you don't have to stick exactly to the instructions in the activities (e.g. don't think that you have to write five sentences – do what you think your child

Session 1

To write sentences using capital letters, full stops and joining words (conjunctions: and, because, if) (includes: an

introduction to capital letters and full stops, a video about joining words (conjunctions) and three activities to try at home).

Activity 1: Writing short sentences about caterpillars (Words to include leaves, garden, cocoon, butterfly, wriggling, munching, flapping)

Activity 2: Pretend you are a caterpillar and writing sentences about three things you could do (include 'and', 'if' and 'because').

Activity 3: Make a caterpillar dance using your whole body and then write some sentences explaining some of the actions.

Session 2

To write a fact file about minibeasts using nouns and joining words (conjunctions) to make sentences more interesting (includes: a video about nouns and an introduction to joining words (conjunctions), a video about minibeasts and three activities to try at home).

Activity 1: Make a list of sentences about different minibeasts you saw in the video. Once you've listed them. Try using the words 'and', 'but', 'because' to join sentences together

Activity 2: Making a fact file – choose three minibeasts, give each one a name and write a sentence for each using the words: 'and', 'or', 'but', 'because', 'if' to link ideas together.

Activity 3: Make a game about minibeasts, make sure you use joining words (conjunctions) to include more detail and test other people about your facts. (Session: https://bbc.in/35MwzsD)
