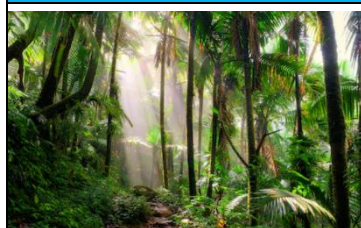

*Last week, British astronaut Tim Peake returned home from an incredible six month stay aboard the International Space Station (ISS), alongside his crew mate Yuri Malenchenko and Timothy Kopra. During their mission, they had to conduct experiments, test out new technology, learn to speak Russian and inspire the next generation of space travellers. Having circled the planet nearly 3000 times in 186 days, the crew returned home via a Soyuz capsule and the touchdown was rather bumpy. Having arrived back on solid ground, the crew were pulled from the capsule and were carried to a medical building to be checked over by doctors.*
