<p>Challenge 1: <u>What shapes can you find?</u> Can you go on a shape hunt round your house and garden? What can you find that are circles, squares, rectangles or triangles? If you look really hard you might find some new shapes!</p>	<p>Challenge 2: <u>Paint your numbers</u> Can you use a paintbrush and a bucket of water to practice writing your numbers outside? Remember to refer back to your number mantra for help!</p>	<p>Challenge 3: <u>Daily Routine</u> Can you try this online lesson with your grown up? The teacher will talk you through what you need to do. <p>Challenge 1: <u>Let's have a go at writing our name!</u> You will need...paper and a pencil/crayon. Get your grown up to write your name for you, now it's your turn to have a go! Can you write it big? Can you write in small?</p>	<p>Challenge 2: <u>Let's get messy!</u> You will need a tray/plate and something we can practice writing in, this could be flour/salt/sugar/paint/shaving foam etc. Pour onto the tray and practice writing your sounds. Can you write a... m d g o c k</p>	<p>Challenge 3: <u>The Three Little Pigs</u> Can you try this online lesson with you grown up? The Teacher will talk you through what you have to do. You will have a quick phonics lesson and then listen to the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. <p>Challenge 1: <u>Who lives in your house?</u> Ask your grown up to make a list of everyone's name in your house. Look at the list, which letters do you recognise? Can you spot your name? Can you read any other names? Do any names begin with the same letter?</p>	<p>Challenge 2: <u>Read while you walk!</u> On your daily walk have a close look at road signs, street names, car registration plates and any other signs. Can you spot any letters that you know together? Do you recognise any logos?</p>	<p>Challenge 3: <u>Read to your toys!</u> Gather your favourite teddies and toys and sit them down comfortably. They may like some cushions or a blanket to sit on. Using one of your favourite stories, show the pictures to your toys and tell them the story. Tell them our listening rules! Make sure they can all see! Can you use some story language such as... Once Upon a Time, One day, Happily Ever After or The end?</p>

<p>Challenge 1 Make a potion! Using an old plastic bottle see if you can make a potion or perfume. Add a little bit of water to the bottle, go outside and add some things from nature. Give your bottle a shake. What can you smell? What is your potion called?</p>	<p>Challenge 2 Mr Maker has a sock puppet. Using an old sock can you create a sock puppet? You could add bits of material or paper with glue or draw on your sock with felt tip pens. Give your puppet a name. Ask your grown up to send a photo to your teacher!</p>	<p>Challenge 3 Using a potato and paint can you make a picture? Cut the potato in half and dip it into some paint, use this to print with. You can wash the potato to use a different colour. Can you make a caterpillar, a dotted pattern or a person? See what you can create!</p>
