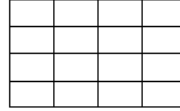

**Flashback: Floating and Sinking**

This week we are going to be having a look back at this to see what you can remember and if there is anything new you can find out. Your challenge is to collect a range of objects from around your house (that are all ok to get wet). Fill a bucket, bath, paddling pool or sink with some water. Before you put the objects in make some simple predictions about what you think will happen to each object. When you have done that, place each object in the water, one at a time and see what happens. As a further challenge, you could take some photos and send them to your teacher or draw a picture to show what you can see. Remember that if the object sinks, that you must draw the object BELOW the water line and if it floats draw the object ABOVE the water line. Have fun!
