
Wellbeing Week

After School Activities

I am writing to inform you that following the start of the second National Lockdown we have now received new guidance in regard to after school clubs. This guidance states that unfortunately we are not permitted under the new restrictions to run any after school clubs for our children.

The guidance states that:

'Out-of-school activities (including wraparound care) may continue to operate if their primary purpose is providing registered childcare. All other out of school activities, not being primarily used by parents for these purposes, should close for face-to-face provision for the duration of the national restrictions.'

We are very upset and fully understand that the children will be too, especially as staff had put lots of work into ensuring that we could run these in line with the previous Covid guidelines. We hope to get these clubs back up and running as soon as the Government guidelines allow.
