Ofsted Outcome

We are delighted to be able to provide you with our latest Ofsted report from our recent inspection which took place on 12th March 2019.

The school has been judged as continuing to be good. During the feedback to senior leaders and governors from the inspector, she said she saw many elements of outstanding practice at our school.

You will see from the many positives contained in the report itself that the inspector noted in particular that:

Leadership at the school '*has created a nurturing and aspirational culture*'

Teachers at the school '*encourage pupils to be ambitious and challenge them to do their best*'

Pupils at the school '*have positive attitudes to learning*' and '*behave well*'.

Parents at the school '*praise the ethos and quality of education their children receive*'.

Governors at the school '*are knowledgeable and ensure actions to improve the school are sustained*'.

The areas the inspector identified for us as being our 'Next Steps' to improve on were things we had identified as needing address already and had already commenced working on. These are around the upgrading of our EYFS Nursery environment and also ensuring consistency in our EYFS Team's provision is further embedded, as this has been affected a little by a number of staff changes.

We are very proud that we have received our third Good Ofsted outcome in a row over the past 9 years and that this demonstrates our drive for improvement as ever is ongoing, to provide your children with the very best.

We also would like to express our sincere thanks to all of you who took the time to submit your questionnaire responses to the inspector, as she shared a number of these with us during her feedback. We were overwhelmed and very touched with the masses of support and lovely things so many of you had submitted.

We also would like to thank you for your children too, they were such a credit to all of you and of course themselves in being polite, confident and enthusiastic about their school in all the conversations the inspector had with a number of them. It is no wonder that we, as a staff, all enjoy working with them so much – they continually make us very proud.

We hope you will join us in congratulating all our highly committed staff who work tirelessly and go the extra mile in so many ways to help ensure that your children make good progress academically and socially.

We very much look forward to continuing to work in partnership with you all and hope you read the report and know that you made the right choice in choosing Sutton Road Primary School for your children. Taking part in sport lowers risk of heart disease, stroke, and diabetes. A healthier heart means reduced risk of cardiovascular disease, stroke, and diabetes.

School Meals

It has been brought to our attention that we need to inform you of a price increase due to take place after the Easter Holiday for all Nottinghamshire County Schools. Therefore, on Tuesday 23rd April 2019 the price of a school meal for schools within our collaboration will increase to £2.32 (currently £2.30).

We would like to urge all parents/carers to decide with their children at the start of the week what days they will be having a dinner and ensure that sufficient dinner money is placed in your child's online sQuid account in advance. This is to ensure that no child gets in to arrears with their payments.

Free School Meals are available to those who qualify and we believe it is important that those who qualify take up their child's entitlement so that they can receive a cooked meal each day. Further information on entitlement to Free School Meals (FSM) may be obtained from the school office or online at <http://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/education/school-meals/free-school-meals-and-milk> If a child's entitlement to free school meals expires or the parents/carers' personal circumstances change, then the parent/carer must provide a packed lunch or send payment in advance for a school dinner. Any parent/carer requiring help with registering for a free school meal claim can be provided with assistance from the school office team.

If you have not yet registered for sQuid please see any member of the office team and they will assist you with this.
